

OTHER STUDENT REFERRALS

ESL Student—Local High School Graduate: These students should be given the Michigan Test instead of the Compass Test. If their scores are high enough, the ESL Coordinator will sign a Compass Waiver for English and reading and direct them to take the COMPASS math section. The Michigan Test is more appropriate for these students. However, if they insist on taking the Compass Test, they may do so. If the scores indicate that they need to take developmental classes, they should be directed to the ESL Program.

ESL—College Graduate—part-time student who wish to take classes for enrichment/who use English as the official language in their countries: (Indian students) These students do not need to take the Michigan Test before taking one or two classes for personal enrichment. However, if they decide to study for a degree, they will need to take the Michigan Test.

ESL/Transfer Student: If these students have completed the equivalent of ENG 101 and ENG 102 with grades of C or above, they do not need to take the Michigan Test. You may register them in an academic or vocational program.

ESL Student who has completed BHC's ESL Program: Before registering a student who has completed the BHC ESL Program, check to see if the student has an Compass Waiver Form on file. These are given to the students when they complete the program. If they do not have a waiver, please call the ESL Coordinator.

ESL Student who has not completed BHC's ESL Program: If you find, after checking Banner, that the student has taken only one or two ESL courses, and the student does not have an Compass waiver form from the ESL Coordinator, please send the student to the ESL Coordinator.
